Instructio

In this exercise, participants will stick badges in various shapes, colors, and sizes some there visibly on the front of their bodies. Participants should then for proups without talking to one another. There are no criteria for what kills of groups should be created. Note for Facilitators

participants usually form groups based on shapes, colors, or sizes. Rarely do the participants look beyond the badges, and even less rarely do they hally form diverse groups in which many shapes, colors, and sizes are resented.
